

# Message from the Principal & Chief Administ

Dear Alumni, Friends & Benefactors of St. Joseph High School,

I want to use this opportunity to express my gratitude to you, the many supporters of our St. Joseph mission, and at the same time, report to you the progress and achievements we made this past year.

As you are probably aware, last September the Christian Brothers presented our Board of Directors with a fundraising campaign goal of raising one million dollars by December 1, 2019. We are beyond grateful that our alumni and friends from across the nation rallied to reach this ever important Brother's Challenge fundraising goal.

I would be remiss if I did not recognize key members who played a vital role in making the Brother's Challenge goal a reality for our school. A special thank you to board members Diane Guido Berner IHM '70, Mark Polivka '70, Paul Remack '67, John Vosicky '66 and our

Director of Development Bob Stapleton '70. These dedicated individuals, known as the Champions of the Four Financial Pillars, are working tirelessly to ensure the mission of St. Joseph High School continues. You will read more about these members on page six of the Annual Report.

Just over \$5.25 million was earned and awarded in merit scholarships and grants to the members of our Class of 2020. Over the past 11 years, our graduating seniors have earned more than \$70 million in support for their own higher, advanced education. Your support of their Charger experience helped make that reality possible!

The start of our 60th Anniversary year was filled with great promise and energy. I know that you will take great pride in our many successes, highlighted in our Annual Report, that our students experienced. I know that you are also aware of the current climate in which we find ourselves as we navigate the unprecedented times surrounding the coronavirus pandemic. The uncertainty that remains can, at times, be unsettling, but the perseverance, strength, and unwavering faith in God continues to motivate our Charger community. I am so proud of our entire community.

Despite the challenges presented last March, with the emergence of Covid-19, the St. Joseph High School alumni and friends have continued to support our mission, noted by \$1,220,043 in fundraising activities. That is a new benchmark!

Our school leadership, faculty and staff continue to keep the bar set high as we have begun our 61st school year, using a hybrid model of both in-person and eLearning education. As we look ahead, we challenge ourselves to examine strategies to grow our school programs and services as well as advance our Lasallian and Catholic mission of education.

Some strategies that we have implemented to ensure our prosperous growth include:

- The detailed inception and application of a Mission and Vision 3-5 Year Business Plan. This plan outlines specific areas in which St. Joseph High School is committed to be a leader among Lasallian high schools and other high schools in and around the southwestern suburbs. **Bill Riley** named head basketball coach. Bill was the assistant varsity basketball coach at St. Joes for 34 seasons alongside Coach Gene Pingatore before his sudden passing on June 26, 2019.

"I consider it an incredible honor to follow in the footsteps of Coach "Ping" Pingatore as the next head coach," said Riley. "Coach Ping's lifelong accomplishments reached far beyond basketball. He was an educator of men and a loyal friend to many. He touched countless lives on and off the court for more than sixty years. I look

forward to the significant responsibility of leading the next generation of Chargers and continuing to develop young men into student-athletes as they mature into adults. Our entire staff is committed to making "Ping" proud and honoring his great career."

Riley served the school as head coach of the sophomore team for 21 seasons, winning 5 conference championships while compiling an overall record of 250–135. Along the side of Coach Pingatore, Riley helped coach the St. Joseph Chargers to two state championships (1999 & 2015), 21 conference championships, 24 state regional titles, and 7 state sectional titles. He also served as bench coach for the 2011 McDonald's All-American games in Chicago.



**Tony Quattrochi** named new director of alumni relations. Tony has now been in education for 42 years, 39 have been in Westchester serving the Chargers.



The success of the campaign generated much enthusiasm on and off campus, resulting in increased interest in the mission of St. Joes. The school is confident it will reach its goal of \$1.5 million for the 2020-21 school year.

**Diane Berner, IHM Class of 1970** and a SJHS Board member, chairs the school's development committee, which is responsible for meeting that goal.

"It's a privilege to be involved at St. Joseph High School. This school makes such a difference in the lives of its students."

Diane's success and experience in strategic planning with LaSalle Bank, where she also served as senior vice president of marketing for over 25 years, serves St. Joes well as she directs major efforts.

"St. Joseph High School is very fortunate to be able to utilize Diane's expertise and experience," said John McAuliffe, the school's executive director of finance and advancement.

School leadership at St. Joseph recently appointed four graduates who are either school board members or members of the development staff to champion what McAuliffe describes as the "four pillars" of the school's financial strategy.

Mark Polivka, Class of '70, coordinates the Charger Nation campaign, forming a group of committed benefactors who contribute \$1,000 to \$9,999 annually for three to five years.

**Paul Remack, Class of '67**, works with foundations nationwide to gain grants in support of financial aid and designated projects.

# FIVE YEAR PILAT



This exhibit lays out financial assumptions for the next 5 years and translates those assumptions into the financial projections from 2021 to 2025. The goal is to grow the St. Joseph High School enrollment from 230 students today to 500 students by June 30, 2025. This requires raising \$1,250,000 in 2021 and increasing this amount over successive years to \$2,000,000 by 2025. This growth will allow the school to increase the amount of financial aid each year, thus enabling more students to attend St. Joseph High School.

Based on the St. Joseph High School Mission and Vision Statement, by 2025 the Board of Director should be responsible for raising \$500,000, the Alumni \$500,000, foundation grants and corporations \$750,000, and school events \$250,000. With an increased enrollment of 500 students and raising \$2 million each year in donations, the financial condition of St. Joes will be greatly enhanced providing amplified opportunities for faculty and students.


