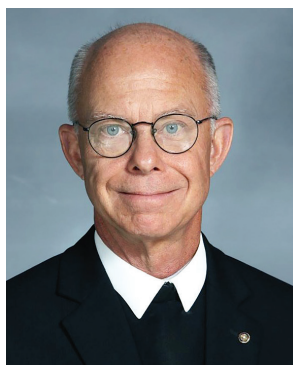

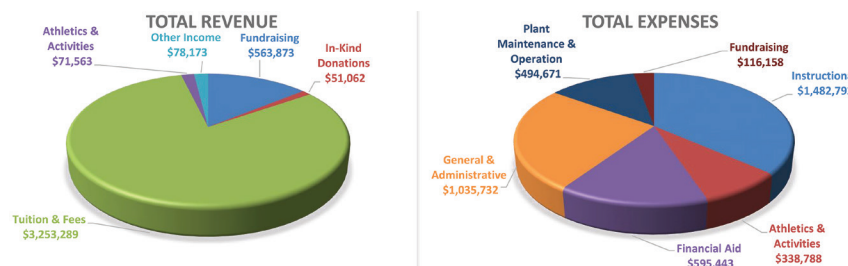


Message from President/Principal

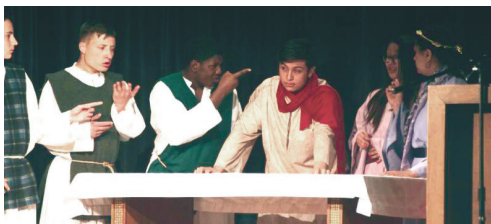
APRIL
