School counselors at **SJHS** provide a comprehensive counseling program based on the national model and standards set forth by the

American School Counseling Association (ASCA). The ASCA model focuses on the three developmental domains of academics, college & career and personal-social. School counselors meet with students in a variety of



ways to address these developmental areas mainly through individual counseling, small group counseling, classroom guidance lessons and periodic check-ins.

School counselors can assist with: college applications & information, career exploration, letters of recommendation, transcripts, ACT & testing information, course selection, academic support, personal concerns, problem-solving & coping skills, work permits and much more.

Services offered by the counseling department involve a proactive approach integrating prevention, education, remediation and crisis management to foster and enhance the learning process. School counselors are trained in identifying the need for long-term counseling support and are able to direct students and parents to appropriate outside resources. Through collaboration with parents, teachers and other professional staff, our school counseling program helps to ensure students have access to and are prepared with the knowledge and skills to become productive members of society.
